

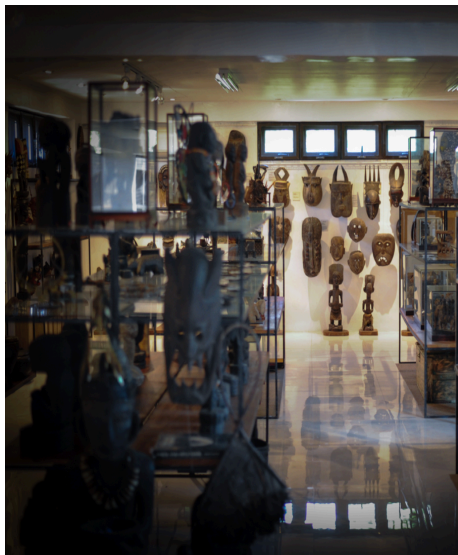
Musaeum Artisté joins International Council of Museums

The International Council of Museums' (ICOM) National Committee in the Philippines has approved the application of Musaeum Artisté to become an institutional member.

"We are happy to inform you that your application to become a member of the International Council of Museums (ICOM) has been processed and is already approved for 2018," the ICOM Philippines said in a letter dated January 15, 2019 which they handed to Musaeum Artisté Founder and President Anthony V. Gedang.

ICOM is an "international organization of museums and museum professionals which is committed to the research, conservation, continuation, and communication to society of the world's natural and cultural heritage, present and future, tangible and intangible."



"Honored to become a member with expectations of learning on how to best manage our museum and also contribute to the fulfillment of the objectives of ICOM," said Gedang.

The ICOM's head committee in Paris, France is yet to verify the membership of Musaeum Artisté.

Musaeum Artisté is a private museum established by Gedang in 2014 in his residence in Quezon City. The museum houses over 10,000 pieces of artworks, relics, tribal arts, artifacts, suisekis, and bonsais which they also lend to different schools and private organizations in the Philippines to help the public to better understand and appreciate the local and foreign cultures, histories, and arts
